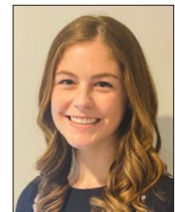

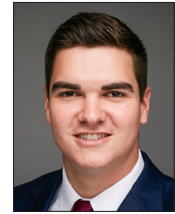

HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT

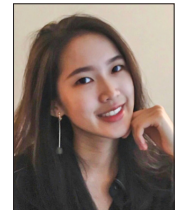

ATHLETIC TRAINING

The Athletic Training major in the Department of Kinesiology offers a concentrated curriculum designed to prepare students for a career in an allied health care profession recognized by the American Medical Association. Students in the accredited competency-based program are eligible to sit for the Board of Certification exam and obtain state credentialing as an Athletic Trainer. Graduates practice in a variety of settings using evidence-based interventions aimed at promoting optimal well-being for physically active populations.

BIOBEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Biobehavioral Health is an innovative major that looks at health issues in an integrated way and considers many different factors—biological, social, cultural, and environmental. It offers a strong foundation for students interested in epidemiology, psychology, genetics, public health, human development, health promotion, and human service, and for those interested in conducting biomedical research or attending medical school.

COMMUNICATION SCIENCES AND DISORDERS

Communication Sciences and Disorders is a program in which students study the prevention and rehabilitation of speech, language, and hearing problems. It has been a national leader for more than seventy years. The major draws on linguistics, acoustics, psychology, and anatomy. Undergraduate students typically go on to graduate study and to gain professional certification and licensure. Undergraduate students typically proceed to graduate study in Speech-Language Pathology and to gain professional, national certification and state licensure. Undergraduate students interested in Audiology go on to earn doctoral degrees.

HEALTH POLICY AND ADMINISTRATION

Health Policy and Administration graduates have the knowledge, skills, and values appropriate to work in entry-level management or policy-related positions—or for the pursuit of graduate education in health policy, health law, health services research, public health, and other health-related fields. Tasked with coordinating a wide variety of activities that are vital to the delivery of health services and programs, health administrators and policymakers play key roles in addressing the complex societal challenges associated with providing access to quality health care at a reasonable cost. Penn State's Health Policy and Administration department has over 50 years of experience teaching undergraduates about healthcare.

HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT

The School of Hospitality Management, was established in 1937, and is the third oldest and one of the most respected programs of its kind in the nation. It combines a broad education with strong leadership, problem-solving, and communication competencies needed to prepare students for management positions in the hospitality industry. There are as many different career opportunities as there are hospitality and entertainment sites and many internationally prominent firms recruit students.

HUMAN DEVELOPMENT AND FAMILY STUDIES

Human Development and Family Studies prepares students to work in areas such as child care, aging, family services, drug and alcohol rehabilitation, health services, and other human service fields. Graduates also are in demand in human resource management. Many students go on to graduate study. The major has two options: Life Span Human Services and Life Span Developmental Science.

KINESIOLOGY

Kinesiology offers a comprehensive program in the study of human movement and is designed for students who want to prepare for professions involving physical activity and for graduate study in related areas. The Kinesiology major includes two options at University Park: Applied Exercise and Health and Movement Science. These options provide concentrated programs of study designed to prepare students for careers in teaching, medical specialties, the fitness and wellness industries, and success in graduate and professional schools.

NUTRITIONAL SCIENCES

Nutritional Sciences majors study how the body uses nutrients for growth and development, how needs change throughout life, and how food contributes to health. The Nutrition and Dietetics option incorporates medical nutrition therapy, nutrition education and counseling, culinary principles of nutrition, and business management. It meets the accreditation standards set by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics. The Nutritional Physiology and Biochemistry option incorporates knowledge from biology, chemistry, physiology, and physics with nutrition. The Behavioral Nutrition and Public Health option integrates social and behavioral sciences with human physiology and nutrition to improve the health and well-being of individuals and populations. Graduates work in diverse settings within the food and nutrition field including hospitals, community agencies, sports nutrition, schools, and food and pharmaceutical industries; many of our graduates will complete post-baccalaureate training and education to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN). Graduates also go on to medical or dental school, or graduate programs and research.

RECREATION, PARK, AND TOURISM MANAGEMENT

Recreation, Park and Tourism Management majors study in one of four options; Commercial Recreation leading to careers in sport management, travel/tourism, attractions and resorts; Community Recreation leading to careers in municipal recreation, parks, and non-profit organizations; Outdoor Recreation leading to careers in environmental education, natural and cultural history interpretation, park and outdoor facilities management, and outdoor experiential leadership; and PGA Professional Golf Management leading to careers as golf professionals.

Our work is relevant to people everywhere, which is why we strive to lead the way in offering high-quality education to our students and in producing research and outreach programs that will positively affect the ways we live today and in the future.

Our faculty members—who are often recognized for their excellence in teaching, research, and outreach—represent some of the most respected leaders in their disciplines and continue to build the college’s strong reputation.

Our students are intelligent, motivated, and passionate. Each semester, students participate in service-learning activities that bring them into direct contact with customers, patients, clients, and consumers of all ages. This offers students the opportunity to hone their professional skills, expand their education, and experience the satisfaction of improving the world. After graduation, our alumni continue to make substantial contributions to Penn State and to society through their jobs and families, and outreach to the community.

Although the college itself is relatively young, its intellectual roots reach back to the earliest days in Penn State history, when exercise and physical fitness were added to the academic curriculum, and when courses were established on the “domestic economy” (which came to be known as home economics).
